Article II -- Membership

- 1) Any person who wishes to become a member of this Association shall submit written application to the Board of Governors and in doing so shall express their willingness to comply with these Bylaws and abide by the Rules promulgated by the Board of Governors. The Board of Governors may accept an application for membership at a regular or special meeting. The application will be considered for acceptance or rejection at the next Board of Governors meeting after the presentation or first reading of the application.
- 2) The classes of membership shall be as follows:
 - a) Active Member
 - b) Associate Member
 - c) Honorary Member
 - d) Student Member
 - e) Junior Member
 - f) Family Membership
- 3) Members are entitled to voting privileges for matters within the organization as follows:
 - a) An Active Member shall be a person at least eighteen (18) years old, who intends to actively participate in the operations of the Wabash, Frisco and Pacific Association, by working at least 10 days per year, to be monitored by department superintendents. This will consist of a minimum of 6 non-operating days and can include 4 days of Sunday operations. Participation guidelines will be reviewed by the Board of Governors at its December meeting. Each active member must complete the 10 work day requirement during the period 12/1 to 11/30 of each fiscal year to be eligible to vote on all matters during the year following the 11/30 closing date. Each Active member shall have one vote in person or by proxy at the Annual meeting or other such special meetings where matters are voted upon. The active member shall also meet the financial requirements of Article V.
 - b) An Associate Member shall be a person of any age, greater than 12 years, who does not wish to actively participate in the Wabash, Frisco and Pacific Association operations and wishes only to ride the trains of the WF&P and observe the development of the Association. This member can become an active member by meeting the active member requirements in section a. above. This member shall have No voting rights. The associate member shall also meet the financial requirements of Article V.
 - c) An Honorary Member shall be a person of any age who has been of extraordinary service to this Association who is elected to this category by the membership or Board of Governors. Such membership is for one year. This member may or may not actively participate in the Wabash, Frisco and Pacific Association and has voting rights.
 - d) A Student Member shall be a person between the ages of twelve years (12) and eighteen years (18) old who intends to actively participate in the operations of the Wabash, Frisco and Pacific Association and has No voting rights.
 - e) A Junior Member shall be a person under the age of twelve (12) years who intends to be an active member in the operations of the Wabash, Frisco and Pacific Association, who is accompanied by a parent or legal guardian at all times while the junior member is on the property or rights of way of the WF&P and has No voting rights.
 - f) Family member shall consist of a parent or guardian, spouse and all dependents in school. All members of the family may participate in the operations. Each family member over age 17 will have to meet the workday requirements to operate a locomotive or to vote.
- 4) All Members shall be entitled to rights, privileges, and duties as described below and promulgated by the Board of Governors.
 - a) The President and Board of Governors shall not deny an Active member's right to vote, if the Active member has met the requirements of Article II, section 3, unless such member has been expelled from the Association.
 - b) All member classes shall be entitled to a riding pass and the Association newsletter in the year of their membership.
 - c) All new members shall be provided one copy of the Association's Articles of Incorporation, Official Bylaws and the Rules and Regulations, upon acceptance of membership to the Association. Members will receive a revision of the aforementioned when warranted as long as their membership remains valid. An additional copy of each may be obtained after the initial distribution by submitting a request in writing to the Secretary.
 - d) Active and Student members shall be notified of anything that is promulgated by the Board of Governors of the Association and of its availability. It is the member's responsibility to acquire the aforementioned by requesting it from the appropriate Association designate.

Missouri Revised Statutes
Chapter 537
Torts and Actions for Damages
Section 537.118
August 28, 2003

Volunteers, limited personal liability, certain organizations and government entities, exceptions.

537.118. 1. As used in this section, the following terms mean:

(1) "Nonprofit organization", an entity which operates under the standards of section 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 as amended;

(2) "Prorated equivalent basis", any other basis for compensation except that used to compensate for expenses actually incurred; and

(3) "Volunteer", an individual performing services for a nonprofit organization or a governmental entity who is not compensated for his services on a salary or prorated equivalent basis. The term shall not include those covered by section 537.117.

2. Any volunteer of a nonprofit organization or governmental entity shall be immune from personal liability for any act or omission resulting in damage or injury to any person intended to receive benefit from such volunteer's service if:

(1) The volunteer acted in good faith and within the scope of his official functions and duties with the organization or entity ;
and

(2) The damage or injury was not caused by the intentional or malicious conduct or by the negligence of such volunteer.

3. Nothing in this section shall be construed to create or abolish an immunity in favor of a nonprofit organization or a governmental entity.

4. The provisions of this section shall apply to all causes of action accruing after August 28, 1989.
